At an awnings factory near Orlando, Florida, a man who had been fired returned to his old workplace and killed five people he had targeted before killing himself.

The 45-year-old U.S. Army veteran, John Robert Neumann Jr., was armed with a semi-automatic handgun and hunting knife.



Most of the victims were shot in the head, some multiple times, according to Orange County Sheriff Jerry Demings.

The identified victims were Robert Snyder, 69; Brenda Montanez-Crespo, 44; Kevin Clark, 53; Jeffrey Roberts, 57; and Kevin Lawson, 46, according to the Orange County Sheriff's Office.

Orange County Sheriff Jerry Demings described Neumann as a disgruntled exemployee but said it was unclear why he was fired or what prompted his actions. There was also a reported that he battered another employee, but no charges were brought, Demings said.
