On April 22, 2020, Spc. Vanessa Guillen was sexually harassed inside an armory at Fort Hood, Texas. Her family said she did not report those incidents for fear of retaliation, though a U.S. Army investigation later found that she reported being sexually harassed twice.



In late summer of 2019, Guillen was the victim of sexual harassment after her superior tried to solicit her in Spanish to participate in a threesome. Guillen's superior was constantly harassing her.

This wasn't the first incident and complaint that has occurred in that facility. They didn't do anything about the sexual harassment complaints until Vanessa Guillen was murdered. Vanessa's story was a wake up call to the facility. The family didn't stop until they found the aggressor that murdered Vanessa Guillen. The environment in Fort Hood could have influenced the superior, knowing that many cases had happened but no actions had been taken.
