A fatal shooting occurred at a city building in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, by one city employee who killed his co-worker he'd disliked for a long time, police said.

The 61-year-old Steven Dewayne Haizlip shot and killed his co-worker, Terry Lee Cobb Jr.

Winston-Salem Police Chief Catrina Thompson told news reporters the gunman got killed during a gunfight with police officers who responded to the scene.



Police Captain Steven Tollie stated that the slain employee and the gunman had a "longstanding dislike for each other," but he couldn't determine the source of their disagreements. Cobb had worked for the city for 20 years, while Haizlip had worked there for 12.

Tollie stated the two men were involved in a physical altercation that wasn't reported at the time to their superiors. Tollie said another city employee was wounded and was "collateral damage."
