AAR: Gunman Sentenced to Five Life Terms Without Parole for Killing Five in Newsroom Shooting

AAR: Gunman Sentenced to Five Life Terms Without Parole for Killing Five in Newsroom Shooting

A mass shooting occurred at the offices of The Capital, a newspaper serving Annapolis, Maryland.

The gunman, Jarrod Ramos, killed five employees with a shotgun and injured two others who were trying to escape.

Ramos was arrested shortly thereafter. He pleaded guilty but not criminally responsible to 23 charges; in July 2021, a jury found him criminally responsible.

In 2011, The Capital published an article about Ramos being put on probation for harassing an acquaintance from high school through social media and email.

Ramos, angered by the article, brought a defamation lawsuit against the newspaper but a judge later dismissed the suit.

Ramos is alleged to have sent letters to The Capital threatening to attack its newsroom and staff, but no legal action was taken.
