A store manager shot and killed six victims at a Walmart in Chesapeake, Virginia.

According to a news release from the City of Chesapeake, five deceased victims were identified: Lorenzo Gamble, Kellie Pyle, Randall Blevins, Brian Pendleton, and Tyneka Johnson.

The sixth deceased victim was a 16-year-old boy who authorities are not naming because he was a minor.

The authorities identified the shooter as 31-year-old Andre Bing, "armed with one handgun and had multiple magazines.". According to the company, Bing was a manager and had worked at Walmart since 2010.

The incident started around 10:12 p.m.and at least 50 people were inside when it happened, police said. The city officials also stated that at least six more people were transported to local hospitals for treatment.
