Radee Prince opened fire at Advanced Granite Solutions in Edgewood on October 18, 2017, killing three of his coworkers and leaving two others wounded, suffering bullet wounds to the head.

After the shooting, Prince drove off, abandoned his car near a high school, and threw away the gun. It is said that the shooting was "targeted," and Prince knew all of his victims. The defense attorney argues that Prince had been bullied at work.

After the shooting, Prince's family said: "they feared he had suffered from untreated mental health problems." However, a psychiatrist stated, "Prince did not have a severe mental illness at the time of the shooting. It is determined he had post-traumatic stress disorder and antisocial personality disorder." They also added that Prince showed no remorse for the victims.
