PE: Risk Assessment

Key Points to Discuss:

- Situational Awareness
- What early warning signs were present before the assault occurred?
- How did the staff's positioning, tone, or body language contribute to escalation or containment?
- What environmental factors (e.g., room layout, exits, objects within reach) influenced the risk level?
- Risk Assessment and Decision-Making
- At what point did the situation shift from "potential risk" to "active threat"?
- How might staff have used dynamic risk assessment to adjust their approach in real time
- What protective strategies could have been implemented earlier?



Key Points to Discuss...(cont.):

Communication and De-escalation

- How did verbal and nonverbal communication affect the outcome?
- What alternative phrases or approaches might have helped de-escalate the situation?
- How can staff maintain calm and control without appearing confrontational or dismissive?

Containment and Safety Protocols

- What containment strategies were used—or missed—during the incident?
- How do we balance physical safety with emotional dignity in moments of crisis?
- What role does team coordination play in managing high-risk scenarios?



Intervention Challenges:

Trauma-Informed Lens

- What might the assailant's behavior be communicating beyond aggression?
- How can staff respond in ways that reduce retraumatization and preserve trust?
- What biases might influence how we interpret and respond to volatile behavior?

Post-Incident Reflection

- What should happen immediately after an assault—both for staff and the individual involved?
- How do we process emotional impact and prevent burnout in high-risk roles?
- What systems need to be in place to support staff recovery and learning?
